TARGET AUDIENCE

This course is designed for all psychosocial care providers working in cancer or palliative care settings. Social workers, psychologists, psychiatrists, mental health trainees, as well as oncologists, oncology nurses, palliative care practitioners of all disciplines will find it beneficial.

COURSE OVERVIEW

Meaning-Centered Psychotherapy (MCP), developed and tested in randomized controlled trials by MSK investigators, represents the major breakthrough in counseling interventions for patients with cancer in several decades. MCP for advanced cancer patients, in both group and individual formats, is highly effective. This course will present a combination of didactics and experiential workshops to introduce the basic concepts and techniques of MCP. Easy to follow Treatment manuals have been published and will be available. Novel adaptations of MCP for Breast Cancer Survivors, Caregivers, and Parents who have lost a child to cancer will also be introduced to course attendees.

LEARNING OBJECTIVES

- 1. Attendees will become familiar with the importance of meaning, as a component of spiritual well-being, and its relationship to depression, hopelessness and desire for death
- Attendees will become familiar with a structured, didactic and experiential 7 – 8 session intervention for cancer patients aimed at sustaining or enhancing a sense of meaning in the face of advanced illness.
- 3. Attendees will be introduced to novel adaptations of MCP for cancer survivors, cancer caregivers, and for bereavement.

Meaning-Centered Psychotherapy

(MCP), developed and tested in randomized controlled trials by MSK investigators, represents the major breakthrough in counseling interventions for patients with cancer in several decades. MCP for advanced cancer patients, in both group and individual formats, is highly effective. This course will present a combination of didactics and experiential workshops to introduce the basic concepts and techniques of MCP. Easy to follow Treatment manuals have been published and are available. Novel adaptations of MCP for Breast Cancer Survivors, Caregivers, and Parents who have lost a child to cancer will also be introduced to course attendees. This course provides an overview of "Meaning Centered Psychotherapy" a novel counseling intervention developed by MSK Department of Psychiatry and Behavioral Sciences Chairman, William Breitbart and MSK investigators. It is an adaptation of Viktor Frankl's Logotherapy developed specifically for cancer patients and empirically shown in several NCI funded RCTs to

be highly effective in improving quality of life, enhancing hope and meaning, and reducing depression, anxiety, despair, and symptom burden distress. Participants will be introduced to the topics of meaning and spirituality as they relate to the oncology and palliative care setting. The basic concepts of Meaning Centered Psychotherapy will be presented and a detailed description of the intervention and the content of each session will be provided.

In this one day course, the morning will consist of didactic lectures describing MCP for advanced Cancer Patients, MCP for Breast Cancer Survivors, MCP for Cancer Caregivers, and MCP Grief Therapy — an intervention for parents who have lost a child to cancer. The use of internet platforms for the delivery of MCP will also be discussed. The afternoon sessions will consist of experiential workshops, facilitated by the course directors, that will allow participants to see the techniques and processes of MCP demonstrated.
